Induction Programme for the New Faculty and RDs

The new appointees, who are on deputation will have to further undergo a trainers' training programme as stipulated by Government of India. Director IMG, in his introductory remarks emphasized the need to continuously refine training skills especially in the context of the unprecedented changes and challenges faced by bureaucracy.

Centre for Good Governance (CGG) firms up Action Plan

Centre for Good Governance, an initiative of IMG, has drawn up the Action Plan for the year 2021-22. Under the plan CGG will compile the best practices in e-governance and administrative innovations that have been short listed in the previous years for consideration of e-governance award and Chief Minister's awards. Under the Action Plan, IMG faculty are encouraged to take up action research that could lead to recommendations on improving governance. CGG will also start a monthly lecture series on governance-related issues. A National Conclave on the challenges of governance in the post-COVID phase will be held in February 2002. An edited volume containing significant articles on the various challenges and opportunities of governance will be published by March 2022. CGG would convey to the Government various recommendations which are thrown up during the training programmes which have a bearing on better governance.

IMG Constitutes a Technical Committee

A technical committee has been constituted for advising and supervising the various civil works at the IMG and its regional centres from time to time. The committee consists of Shri S. S. Namoothiri, Retired Deputy Superintending Engineer PWD, Shri Jolly Ullas, Retired Chief Engineer, Travancore Devaswom Board and Shri G. Mohanan, Retired Additional Chief Town Planner. The committee is mandated to scrutinize estimates, tender documents and bills. The first meeting of the technical committee is on 15th of September.
